Worksheet - Send Away - to be used in conjunction with the Training Manual


The Send Away area is marked out by the milk bottles. The dog is approximately one metre short of the target area.

What will be the deduction?


The Send Away area is marked out by the milk bottles. The dog has entered the area through the front markers then curled to the right. The dog has half its body in the correct area and half out.

What will be the deduction?


The Send Away area is marked out by the milk bottles. The dog has entered the area through the front markers then curled to the left as the handler called "down" and is just outside the area.

What will be the deduction?


The Send Away area is marked out by the milk bottles. The dog is six paces short and one pace to the right of the area.

What will be the deduction?


The dog has downed in exactly the right area. He is sniffing the ground though.

This dog has run about four paces from the handler and downed itself. How many marks are you going to deduct and explain your reasons?


This dog has downed itself about six paces short of the send away area. It is also halfway between the corner and the milk bottles. How many marks are you going to deduct and explain your reasons?
